A study released in 2000 that found the strongest predictor of a child's future church attendance is based on the father's regular attendance to mass during the child's formative years. The study found that between 66 and 75 percent of children whose fathers regularly attend church go on to become at least irregular churchgoers as adults, even if the mother does not practice.

Closer to home I had a Brother Knight make a statement that also stuck with me. His comment was what a strong influence we had on younger men of our parish. ## Mother's Day Flower Sales

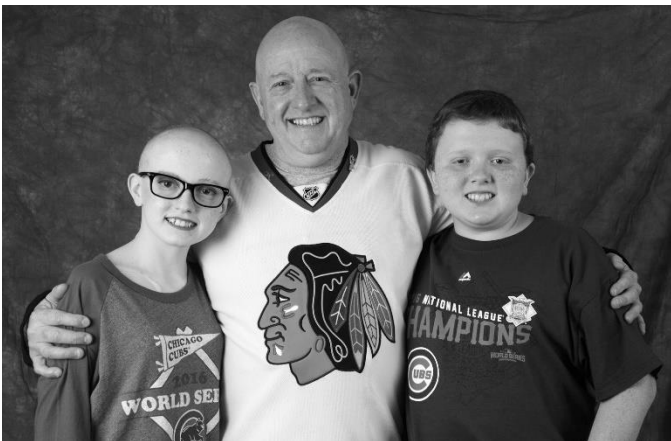
