From the Grand Knight's Desk:

Brothers,

The 2nd quarter of the calendar year (or last quarter of the fraternal year) are usually somewhat quiet for us when compared to the Lenten and the Christmas seasons but that's just because you guys do so much during those other times. You still have done rosaries, dine and shares, cleaned up Algonquin Road, sold Mother's Day gifts, and built nativity sets for next season already. You are also going to do manpower events, host a fundraiser carryout / tailgate for a parish family, more rosaries, membership degree ceremony, attend the IL state convention, enjoy the state Kamporee, put on a blood drive, and initiate the new slate of officers for our council. That's a busy quarter.

The fundraiser carryout / tailgate is for the O'Hearn Family. Nick O'Hearn was the husband to our parish school principal Brenna O'Hearn's family. He suddenly passed away last month. He was far too young. PGK Andre Manaolis stepped up and proposed a fundraiser for the family. He put together a committee, picked a date, had a flyer put together, and it was full steam ahead from there. It is so gratifying to watch as our "men of action" continue to step up and follow the first tenet of the order – charity.

The PGK trustees and a few officers met last month to discuss the openings in our officer slate. We agreed upon asking 3 outstanding Catholic gentlemen to join the officer ranks and they all accepted. I expect these men will carry on the tradition of our order and our council wonderfully like our previous officers have for all of the years of our council.

Ty Simmons, the Illinois State New Council Development Director, visited us last month at our general meeting. He spoke about how we should make a push for finding new Knights to join our order for our next degree ceremony on Sunday, May 23rd. Golf Club of Illinois reduced the minimum number for us below the original contract number and then graciously allowed us to postpone the event altogether when our costs were going to essentially be double. Maybe this will be a blessing in disguise and even more people will have the opportunity to attend.

This is also an opportunity for existing 4th degree members to attend and support the new candidates as well as refresh your memories on the lessons taught in this degree. In addition, McDonnell Hall has been secured for a small group (both candidates and observers) to observe for those who are comfortable doing so as this may be a more meaningful experience.

As a reminder there is NO EXPERIENCE NECESSARY to participate in these honor or color guards and there are NO LOCATION BOUNDARIES OR RESTRICTIONS to participate in these functions in the area. Especially as all assemblies are working to rebuild their Color Corps, we need to step forward and help each other out which includes honor and color guard requests outside of our typical geographic area. If we want others to support us at our events, we need to reciprocate that is the brotherly and fraternal thing to do.

Just as it is important to grow membership in the Knights of Columbus so we can continue to do the good works that we do, it is equally important to advance members to the patriotic (4th) degree to ensure we have enough members to promote the visible degree of our order, serve at a wake, etc.

Dear Brother Knights of Columbus,

Our calling to be a member of the Knights of Columbus is an element of our spiritual lives. It is a help for us to live as a Catholic man in the company of other men committed to the practice of our faith, in its belief and charity.

This month, we have the special joy that the long prayed for beatification of our founder, Father Michael McGivney, will take place on Saturday, October 31 at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford, Connecticut. We are honored that the Mass will be celebrated by His Eminence Cardinal Joseph Tobin of Newark.

This ceremony, a recognition by the Church of the sanctity of Father McGivney, should touch each of us personally. Father McGivney founded the Knights on February 6, 1882. He did so to keep Catholic men in their faith and to provide a means for providing the charity of financial protection for families of deceased members. He also stressed a life of service by each member, contributing to his parish, his community and his family. Our Order likewise emphasizes our fraternal support for each other and our patriotic attachment to our country.

Each of us, then, at whatever degree we might be enrolled, is an heir to this living and on-going legacy of Father McGivney. The Beatification of our founder is not simply a moment to rally around the beginning of our history. It is also an opportunity for each of us to reflect on how blessed we are to be Knights, and to review our spiritual commitment to the task Father McGivney began.

The Beatification also reminds us that we long to be part of the Communion of Saints. We honor those who have gone before for their example and teaching of sanctity. Each Blessed and every canonized saint is a unique example of drawing close to Christ and to the Church. We also recognize in the Communion of Saints, intercessors who long for us to join them before the Lord.

In a special way, as Knights of Columbus we can and should call upon Father McGivney in prayer that he might place our personal spiritual needs and petitions before our Heavenly Father.

Brothers, as we approach this wonderful day of recognition of our founder, may God grant all of us the grace and resolve to live our Catholic faith fully as worthy Knights of the Order founded by Father McGivney.
