Either way, that is the last bill I can send via e-mail. The next notice is called "Intent to Suspend". It will go out in mid-February and must go out via US Mail. Pro-Life Activities (George Jost)

I came across an interesting article about lethal injections used to effect the death penalty. In order to avoid pain to the death row inmates, sodium pentathol is used as a first step, followed by other drugs. In order to avoid being linked to the death penalty, drug companies no longer make these drugs, and States are forced to look to other means to carry out the death penalty. Wyoming, which has no one on death row, has a voted to use a firing squad as the next choice. (Utah is the only other state to use a firing squad.) The Supreme Court has decided to consider the case brought by death row inmates challenging a new drug protocol.

My purpose here is not to discuss the use of the death penalty. I want to discuss the "elephant in the room", namely a baby, thousands of babies every day, put to death without the benefit of a trial, defense council, a jury, and even a lack of appeal. A baby accused of being a mistake, an inconvenience, a failure of birth control (40% of all abortions). Once "convicted" of one of these "crimes", is sentenced to death without benefit of a painless death. Serial killers, terrorists, and those committing gruesome murders have more of a chance of avoiding the death penalty than an unwanted innocent baby. (Many states, Illinois included, have moratoriums preventing executions of death row convicts.)

Last week there was a chance to pass a bill limiting the age after which a fetus could not be aborted to 20 weeks because it was concluded that they could sense pain after that time. Instead a bill was considered that would defund abortions was substituted. Supposedly it will be modified to a more agreeable version and resubmitted soon.

Half of pregnancies among American women are unintended, about 4 in 10 of these are terminated by abortion. Twenty-one percent of all U.S. pregnancies (excluding miscarriages) end in abortion. (AGI). There were 4,131,019 live births last year and roughly 1,000,000 abortions.
