Culture of Life

The next Pro Life event will be the Signature Ad for the Northwest Herald. This Pro Life Ad will appear in The North West Herald January 24th (the closest Sunday to the Anniversary of Roe v Wade which legalized Abortion in the U.S.) With the 142 lines of parishioners' sign ups, the Pro Life committee received \$1050 to help defray the cost of the ad. Knights of Columbus Council 11091 and all 142 parishioners will appear in the ad.

A few months ago we were exposed to the evil that is Planned Parenthood (PP) with the release of the tapes of PP's various representatives discussing the selling of body parts of aborted fetuses, as well cutting out these parts just before the baby was aborted, while still alive.

Another recording has recently surfaced of an abortion provider, Renee Chelian, who is an abortion provider in the Detroit area. It is not surprising that she is in the Detroit area as PP has 70 % of its abortion clinics in black communities. She originally used a company which collected the aborted bodies and incinerated them. They would then issue a "Certificate of Destruction" certifying the babies had been burnt and destroyed. However, the company decided they wanted out. Renee had to figure out a new way since her string of Abortion Mills was too successful and the bodies were piling up. She considered going out into the Michigan woods and putting them into a huge bonfire., but afraid her car would break down and how would she explain her cargo. Then in desperation, she came up with an even more bizarre idea, give the remains back to the mother and make them dispose of the body! They would put the aborted body into a gift bag, then the mother could take it home and figure out what to do with it. "It's their pregnancy, and why is it our problem?"

We need to realize that abortion is not just a single idea. Abortion comes from the ideas of an elite group who tend to espouse liberal ideas. Abortion especially comes from the ideas of Margaret Sanger, founder of Planned Parenthood, and known Eugenicist who was once quoted as saying, "We do not want the word to go out that we want to exterminate the Negro population, and the (black) minister is the man who can straighten that idea out if it ever occurs to any of their more rebellious members."
