I am honored and humbled that you have placed your trust in me and our current slate of Officers. We have much work to do this year and I hope to write a beautiful chapter for this Council with you all.



Culture of Life

The previous month's Pro life News is a mixed bag particularly since the Supreme Court ruled against itself 2 weeks ago

"Republican presidential candidate Donald Trump today condemned the decision the Supreme Court

handed down on Monday reversing part of a pro-life Texas law that protects women's health and has also saved the lives of thousands of unborn children and closed abortion clinics that can't ensure adequate protection for women.

The high court ruled 5-3 against the Texas pro-life law with Justice Stephen Breyer writing the decision." *LifeNews.com*

"When the Supreme Court partly overturned Texas' pro-life law protecting women and unborn childcare from unsafe abortion clinics that couldn't follow the same health and safety standards as legitimate outpatient surgical clinics, pro-life advocates knew the law had been saving unborn babies from abortions. Now we know just how many. According to new figures from the Texas health department — some 9,000 babies were saved from abortions under the pro-life law compared with the number of abortions the year before it went into effect. Undoubtedly more babies would have been saved every year in future years thanks to the prolife law had not the abortion industry and Planned Parenthood decided to take it to court and the Supreme Court struck it down". Lifenews "On Monday (June 27th), the Supreme Court reversed part of a pro-life Texas law that protected women's health, saved the lives of thousands of unborn children and closed abortion clinics that could not ensure adequate health and safety protections for women.

At issue in the ruling were two provisions: that abortion clinics meet the same building standards as ambulatory surgical centers and that abortionists have admitting privileges at a nearby hospital for situations of medical emergencies.

Texas and many other states passed the regulations based on recommendations from the grand jury in the horrific Kermit Gosnell abortion case in Philadelphia.

Gosnell's abortion facility was labeled a "house of horrors" after state inspectors found gruesome, unsanitary conditions, injured patients and the remains of late-term babies who were born alive and then killed with scissors. Gosnell later was convicted of murdering three newborn babies, contributing to a female patient's death and committing hundreds of other crimes.

Prosecutors in the case said Gosnell got away with his crimes for decades because of the lack of government oversight of abortion clinics. According to authorities investigating the case, hair and nail salons were subject to greater scrutiny than abortion clinics in Pennsylvania. Even some politicians who identify as pro-choice supported the regulations to protect women and babies from such atrocities. But the U.S. Supreme Court sided with abortion activists on Monday, claiming the regulations impose an "undue burden" on women's access to abortion. "Lifenews.com

We continue to trust in God's mercy for the aborted babies, and as Christians should pray for the abortionists (many of them who claim to be Catholics). I'm having a tough time with that.

Just because the Assembly thought of it doesn't mean that all Knights aren't welcome. **ALL Sir Knights are required to be in attendance** and 1st, 2nd and 3rd degree knights *should* be there for the event. This event is not really all about us Knights, its really about the invitees
