Catholic Assistance Missions

At the February meeting, I requested a \$3,000 budget for Catholic Assistance Missions (CAM). As part of this request, a notice has to be published in the newsletter before the vote at a general meeting. This letter is the notice, which explains the organization and the request. I plan to make a motion for this donation at the March general meeting.

Catholic Assistance Missions is a nonprofit charitable organization. Its main purpose is to provide food education, and housing for the very poor people of Haiti. CAM is managed by a board of 12 people, mostly from parishes in the McHenry deanery. Five of those board members are from Saint Margaret Mary Parish: Mary Kay Horney, Patty Deroo, Sandy Wiener, Connie Miller, and Donald Miller. All the board members try to take annual mission trips to Haiti at their own cost. At these mission trips, we spend some time with the Missionaries of Charity in Port-au-Prince, and some time at the mountain village of Despinasse. Most of our financial resources are used at Despinasse. CAM has built a school, and is considering helping with a second building at the same site. The school has 300 students from preschool to sixth grade. CAM pays the teachers' salaries, and subsidizes the daily hot meals that the children receive. In many cases, this is the only meal that they have during the day. The annual budget for the salaries, meals, and other school expenses is about \$25,000.

In addition to school support, CAM has built several 2 room houses. These are very simple cement block structures, but they are like castles to the villagers of Despinasse. They are so thrilled to have a safe and comfortable place to live.

CAM raises its money through various fundraisers in the McHenry County parishes. In 2014, the people of Saint Margaret Mary Parish raised \$8,500 at the Ladies Fall Luncheon. CAM also received about \$2,000 in donations from the 2014 Lenten projects of St. Margaret Mary School and Religious Education children. Also in 2014, the people of Church of Holy Apostles raised about \$15,000 at their annual fundraiser dinner.

Our K of C council has been very generous in the past, for which we are very grateful. This year, I am requesting the same contribution that our council made last year, \$3,000 in 4 payments of \$750. Haiti is the poorest country in our hemisphere, and so much can be done by those who care.

Contributions of cash (checks payable to CAM) are the most efficient. Thanks & May God bless you.

Pro-Life Activities (George Jost)

Last Month I wrote an article in which I discussed the various legal procedures that are followed to insure prisoners found guilty and sentenced to be executed, are prevented from suffering, while we can't prevent babies from being aborted while they probably feel pain. (Google - saline solution and dismemberment as abortion methods).

The Feb 26th, 2015 issue of the Wall Street Journal had a opinion piece on Terri Schiavo. In 1990 she suffered a Cardiac arrest and suffered brain damage. She was put on life support including a feeding tube. A feeding tube kept her alive for 15 years. In 2001, it was removed briefly, but reinserted after an appeal. If you remember, 10 years ago (2005), her case was finally adjudicated and her feeding and fluid tube was removed March 18th, and she died March 31. She was essentially starved and dehydrated to death over 13 days. (Imagine just totally fasting for more than a week! Usual time to death is 8 - 10 days without water and 3 weeks without food.) Pope John Paul II, President Bush, and Governor Jeb Bush all tried to intervene, to no avail. The US Senate gave unanimous consent to wanting the appeal sent to the Federal Courts (including Barack Obama, who later said his concurrence was a mistake), to no avail.

Pro Life doesn't just mean trying to prevent abortions, but also protecting all life from conception through natural death.

The 17th Kairos Retreat at Stateville Prison, Crest Hill, IL is scheduled for March 26th-29th. This retreat is an ecumenical version based on Catholic Cursillo. One thing we bring in as a symbol of God's love (Agape) is home made cookies. We never want these to run out and we are handing these out all weekend to inmates and guards. The team needs to have over 2000 dozen for the weekend to assure "God's love doesn't run out". As simple as this concept is, they really feel forgotten by society and hearing that people on the outside spend time praying and cooking for them is moving.
