BOSTON, MA, April 24, 2014 (<u>LifeSiteNews.com</u>) Three "married" lesbians in Massachusetts have announced they are expecting the first of several children intended for their polygamous union. But marriage advocates say the story confirms their warnings about the slippery slope created by redefining marriage and granting legal privileges based on a self-identified characteristic like sexual orientation.

Until it occurred, proponents of same-sex "marriage" dismissed the argument that gay "marriage" would undermine monogamy. But Dr. Jennifer Roback Morse, founder and president of <u>The Ruth Institute</u>, said she was not surprised to learn of the trio. "We have been saying for some time that once you remove the gender requirement there is no reason for marriage to be confined to only two people," Dr. Morse told LifeSiteNews. The slippery slope was anticipated in this as was "gay marriage".

And, if you do choose to annuitize, you also have several payout options.
