We are again offering a Thanksgiving feast to Sailors from Great Lakes Naval Training Center on Thanksgiving Day. I know that this is a day that we spend with our families, but any time you can give on behalf of these sailors who are away from their homes, is always greatly appreciated. Helpers, our timetable is as follows:

- We start **setting up** around 8 AM. (put up decorations, set up Internet access, and the NFL game. Also get the hallway ready for phone call and games)
- Sailors should **arrive** at the school around 10.
- Cooking is going to start at 9:30 AM so we can serve the first meal around Noon. The second meal will be served around 4 4:30 PM. Most of the food just needs to be warmed up. But, we do cook the turkeys, mash potatoes and gravy.
- Clean up will get into full swing after the Sailors leave around 5:30. Generally we will have the dining area and kitchen done as soon as the last meal is finished.

They place particular focus on providing behavioral health support via trained counselors and face-to-face visits in an outpatient setting but individuals can call, email or chat with IWAP's expert personnel to discuss any number of challenges and receive prompt referral support:
