Whether it be marching in a parade, participating in an honor guard for the Bishop, or serving as part of an honor guard at a fallen brother's wake is truly a humbling and honored experience. As a reminder there is NO EXPERIENCE NECESSARY to participate in these honor or color guards and there are NO LOCATION BOUNDARIES OR RESTRICTIONS to participate in these functions in the area. We know that not everyone has their own regalia, if you are looking to participate in an activity but don't have regalia reach out to a member who does. If you need a list of members who have regalia please contact Mark Halper. The deadline for wearing the current existing uniform and regalia has been extended to June 30, 2019, so all who have access to regalia and are physically able to participate are

encouraged to do so as often as possible, this includes outside of your home Parish and community. This also includes folks whose tuxedos did not get shrunk at the dry cleaners.

You and your family are invited to attend the 2019 Annual Illinois State Council Kamporee. We have once again scheduled for the weekend before Father's Day, June 7, 8, 9, 2019. The weekend will be full of faith, fraternalism and just plain old good fun for the entire family. You are welcome to come in early and stay.

The 2019 Kamporee will be held at **Lena KOA** near Lena IL. The park website is lenakoa.com Lena is located west of Freeport IL, on U. S. Hwy 20. From Chicago take Northwest Toll-Way (I-90) to Rockford and then go west on U. S. Hwy 20. Take the by-pass around Freeport (the sign will say Galena) to the campground.

We have sites reserved with Full Service and Water & Electric Sites. Tenters should reserve a water & electric site. There are limited Cabins available. The registration deadline for our block of sites is **April 15**, **2019**. After that date the sites will be released.

Please register with the Kamporee Committee by May 25th so we can have sufficient food for the ice cream social and the pancake breakfast.

2019 Rates will apply. Costs per night will be about \$45 for full hook-up and \$35 for Water and Electric. Tents sites are about \$30.00. There is a 10% discount on all sites and cabins. All that is necessary is that you place a phone call:

- To Lena KOA at 800-562-5361. Do not reserve on the lenakoa.com website.
- 3) Tell them you are with the Illinois Knights of Columbus Kampers.
- 4) The campground will ask for your contact information.
- 5) Give your date of arrival & departure.
- 6) What type of site you need. Full Service, Water & Electric, Tent or a Cabin.
- 7) How many in your family.

(A family unit is defined as two adults with their children less than 18 years of age.)

They will hold sites in our section until April 15th

They will require the first night's fee as a deposit.
