From the Grand Knight's Desk:



Brothers,

I reported to you last month that the diocese has mandated that we do **not** hold food events like the tailgate parties that we had been doing. Father Peter called them to

confirm the specifics and unfortunately that is the case. So, we are stuck not doing that type of event for the near future. While this is disappointing, please remember that doing food events doesn't define who we are as Knights and we can continue on without them for the time being. There are plenty of things for us to do as Knights to spread the word of the Lord and to help those who need help. This pandemic will eventually end but and things will get back to "normal" but until it does, there are still plenty of things for us to do.

We have the ID drive coming up the weekend of September 11-13 and the Hammer Open will be Sunday, September 13th. Christmas Tree Lot planning meetings will begin this month. In the McGivney building, we plan to do further cleanup / optimization. We are going to reconfigure some of the storage shelves, toss some old materials no longer needed, and sell some items that aren't being used anymore. I'm targeting Saturday, September 19th for this. I'll share more on this as we get closer to the date.

We will also be doing an Adopt a Highway cleanup on a Saturday, September 19. We are looking at doing a new project replacing the cabinets and countertop behind where we do food lines in McDonnell Hall. Ken Prigge and Greg Freund are scoping this out and will be asking for help when we start the physical work on it. The new magnet website (<u>http://kcchristianshop.com/</u>) is up and running and the team is looking at different ways to advertise. Ken and Ed Henning are working on how to expand our product line of things that we make on the CNC machine. You'll hear more about this soon from them.



Especially as all assemblies are working to rebuild their Color Corps, we need to step forward and help each other out which includes honor and color guard requests outside of our typical geographic

area. If we want others to support us at our events, we need to reciprocate that is the brotherly and fraternal thing to do.

<u>Illinois Family of the Year</u> <u>from our Council!</u>



I don't need to tell you how great this is for our chosen family and our Council. Our Council beams with pride to have such members. To help explain, here is an excerpt from the speech given to introduce the Illinois Family of the year at the recent State meeting:

"Thank you to all the councils that submitted Families of the Year for consideration. This was a very difficult decision that came about after much thought and prayer.

This gentleman joined the Knights of Columbus in 2003, took his second and third degrees in 2004 and joined the fourth degree later in 2004. Over the course of his Knights of Columbus career he along with his family have assisted in numerous events and programs including but not limited to breakfasts, fish fries, Feed My Starving Children, and local community events where the council had a food booth. He has co-chaired the Council Family Christmas party, along with chairing the ID drive and Christmas tree lot. He held several officers and directors' positions over the years, including Grand Knight from 2011-2012 which the council earned the Star Council award under his fearless leadership. As a member of the Fourth Degree Color Corp he served in numerous honor guards and color guards over the years at parades, wakes, Confirmations, and other special Masses.

His children attended St. Margaret Mary elementary school and Marian Central Catholic High School. While in grade school all his children were Altar Servers, and in high school they continued to be Altar Servers, working with the *Clergy as coordinators, advisors and mentors to the vounger servers. While the children were in high* school, they became actively involved with the youth ministry, and in turn our Brother Knight and his wife became actively involved. His children were also involved with scouting, our brother and his wife assisted as pack and troop leaders and after the children retired from scouting he remained on as Chartering Organization Liaison. His wife has been a schoolteacher and faculty leader at St. Margaret Mary elementary school for many years.

His sons joined the Knights of Columbus in 2015 and one of his sons took his second and third degrees in 2016. One of his sons is presently in his fifth year in the Seminary, en route to fulfilling his calling for the Priesthood.

Our Brother Sir Knight along with his wife currently head the Parish's committee for vocations, which include fundraisers (including working with the Vocation Support Raffle Program) as well as the Traveling Chalice Program. Our brother is currently director of the council's Vocations committee, coordinating with the Diocese for Seminarian support. Our brother Knight along with his wife also played key roles in a local youth baseball organization for many years, giving local children and families opportunities for sportsmanship growth. In addition, they coordinate a local bowling league at a local bowling alley, 95% of the league participants are members of their Church, while 90% of the league participants are Knights council members or their family members. It is my pleasure and honor to recognize the **Rick Orabutt family from St. Margaret Mary Algonquin council #11091 as the Illinois Knights of Columbus Family of the Year for 2019-2020.**"

As Master of the Northern Illinois District, I am proud to announce a Virtual Fourth Degree Exemplification on Saturday, November 7, 2020 from 10:00 AM to 12:00 noon. Because of the current coronavirus pandemic, we are advised by the Supreme Council and the State Governor to NOT hold public group events, therefore we will be conducting a "virtual" Fourth Degree Exemplification.

The Host Assembly is Andrew D Mitchell Assembly #215, Kirk Reinhart, Navigator and Co-host Assembly is Father Mazzuchelli Assembly #192, Thomas Willison Navigator.

All Assemblies in the Northern Illinois District are invited to participate in this Exemplification.

Enclosed you will find the instructions on how to complete and process a Form 4 for each candidate (if one has not already been processed) and instructions on what to do on the day of the exemplification, including how to access the video/phone conference.

Please forward this information to every member of your Council and Assembly. It is recommended that small groups of fourth degree members and candidates gather in a council or parish hall that has a good internet or WIFI system and project the video conference on a large screen or TV.

At the conclusion of the exemplification, the Faithful Navigator of each new Fourth Degree member will be mailed the social baldric, Fourth degree lapel pin, a new member certificate and holder. Per the enclosed instructions, the Faithful Navigator will be authorized to Knight the new member at such time that it is safe to gather.

We are in very challenging times, but we all need to do our part to continue to move forward. Only through the efforts of each assembly in the District, can we grow our membership and make this Exemplification a great success. Let us set a record for Sir Knights joining our ranks and help a brother Knight complete the process. "NOW IS THE TIME FOR THE FOURTH DEGREE".

We are doing a great service to someone who either can't do the project or can't afford to have it done. Maybe the neighbors or even the press will hear about our good deeds. 
