The 2022 version of the Men's Fall Retreat is now set to happen September 28th to October 2nd.

For those of you who are not familiar with the Fall Retreat event, it's an extended weekend get-away in the Wisconsin North Woods. For around 10+ years we have been going on a men's outing to get-away from the hustle and hassle of everyday life, and to enjoy some brotherhood, camaraderie and some well-earned relaxation with your Brother Knights. Activities range from fishing, hiking, ATV's, cards, games, fire-works, biking, target shooting, campfires, outdoor Rosary, a group Mass or general chill and sit back and do nothing. So many opportunities for memories and stories we'll talk about for years.

The home we have been renting is no longer available, but we've found another gem of a Northwood cabin. For those familiar with the other cabin, this one is a huge step up in accommodations. Yes we'll be roughing it in the newly remodeled 11,000 square foot cabin with enough individual beds for everyone. No more sleeping on couches or a large bunk room. With new features like the game room, theater and 18 hole frisbee golf we'll find some new avenues for additional Knights memories and stories.

This year we'll leave on Wednesday September 28th and return on Sunday October 2.

The maximum amount of participants is 35, though the house can handle more, I'm setting the limit to 35 to ease the logistics and food management.

To lock in your commitment a \$100 deposit is required to reserve your spot. Check will be refundable up until August 31st. Check or cash to be provided to Ken Prigge. Check made out to the Knights of Council 11091. Commitment of the 35 based upon receipt date of the deposit.

With 35 participants the total estimated cost for the 4/5 days is approximately \$325, this includes the group transportation, food and lodging. At less than \$100 per day the spots will go fast.

The Knights of Columbus are hosting a blood drive on the 1st of May in McDonnell hall from 7 till 1 PM, please plan on attending and giving the gift of life!

If you can not make this blood drive, please consider donating at the Vitalant Center in Crystal Lake, IL. Their phone number is 877-25-VITAL (84825) or go to www.vitalant.org Please tell the staff that the donation is to be made for U202 which is the code for St. Margaret Mary Knights of Columbus. To give blood you must be 17 years old or older and in good health and bring a photo ID. You can also give blood if you are age 16 with the written consent of a parent.

Some pointers to consider: In the days before the drive please make sure to get a healthy amount of iron from food. Meat and seafood, as well as vegetables like spinach and sweet potatoes, are good sources of iron. Certain breads, fruits, and other foods like beans and even tofu can be good. The day of the blood drive, prepare yourself by drinking plenty of fluids and wearing comfortable clothes with sleeves that you can easily roll up above your elbow.

Rockford Diocese Chapter

The Rockford Diocese Chapter was formed in 1989 by Bishop Arthur J. O'Neill and Past State Deputy and Former Vice Supreme Master Joseph Kaltwasser. The purpose of the Chapter is to unite the Knights of Columbus councils within the Diocese and provide a forum for councils to share knowledge and experiences, discuss methods, procedures, ideas, or practices, as well as resolve or obtain assistance in resolving issues or questions and assist each council by providing the tools needed to help achieve Council goals.

The Chapter meets once every three months, on the fourth Wednesday of January, April, July, and October. This is open to all members of the Knights of Columbus in good standing, and is a great opportunity to meet and interact with your Knights of Columbus peers from other Parishes in the Diocese.

Each year the Chapter hosts an annual roundtable dinner to honor a few men (both clergy and lay) for their contributions to the Knights of Columbus, the Catholic Church, and community. We have been blessed to have a few members of our council honored at this event in previous years. Next years event is being planned, stay tuned for times and dates. People are encouraged to attend and support the honorees.

As our council has become a leader in the Rockford Diocese, this is our opportunity to lead by example through participation, sharing knowledge, and also receiving knowledge.
