RECYCLING AND WHEELCHAIR PROGRAM

The Knights of Columbus Council #11091 started an aluminum can recycling program 20 years ago to raise money for charity and reduce the waste generated from our social events. The program expanded to aluminum foil pans used at our food events and continued to grow beyond that to nonprecious metals and alloys. As the popularity grew, we built a 'Can Corral' to house the materials until we had a chance to recycle them for funds.

We saved the money collected and came across 'The Wheelchair Foundation', a nonprofit organization that would match a \$75 donation to purchase a new \$150 wheelchair. The wheelchairs were earmarked for people in developing countries who are impacted by war, poverty, or illness, and would not otherwise have access to a wheelchair. These wheelchairs can be donated in honor of a loved one, and a certificate of the recipient is then mailed to the person or family of the loved one in acknowledgement of their gratitude.

We have recently started handing out plastic bags at our food events, in hopes our community can help with the cause by saving their aluminum cans. So far, our Knights of Columbus Council has collected and recycled over TEN TONS of aluminum cans. Combined with the other miscellaneous metals, we have raised over \$15,000, which equates to purchasing approximately 100 wheelchairs for people in need. We are in the process of saving enough money to fill a shipping crate with wheelchairs that will be delivered to the needy. Please take home a bag today – instructions are provided!

Rockford Diocese Chapter

The Rockford Diocese Chapter was formed in 1989 by Bishop Arthur J. O'Neill and Past State Deputy and Former Vice Supreme Master Joseph Kaltwasser. The purpose of the Chapter is to unite the Knights of Columbus councils within the Diocese and provide a forum for councils to share knowledge and experiences, discuss methods, procedures, ideas, or practices, as well as resolve or obtain assistance in resolving issues or questions and assist each council by providing the tools needed to help achieve Council goals.

The Chapter meets once every three months, on the fourth Wednesday of January, April, July, and October. This is open to all members of the Knights of Columbus in good standing, and is a great opportunity to meet and interact with your Knights of Columbus peers from other Parishes in the Diocese. The April meeting is Wednesday April 26th and the location is HYBRID (virtual and physical), physical location is at the Church of Holy Apostles in McHenry.

Each year the Chapter hosts an annual roundtable dinner to honor a few men (both clergy and lay) for their contributions to the Knights of Columbus, the Catholic Church, and community. We have been blessed to have a few members of our council honored at this event in previous years. This year's event will take place Wednesday September 27th at Holy Family Catholic Church 4401 Highcrest Rd., Rockford.

In addition, the Chapter hosts an annual bowling tournament, where the winners advance to the state competition. For the past two years our council put together a team which took first place at the Diocese level and advanced to State! Last year our council won second place at the state level! In addition, our very own Michael Barrett took first place individually with Kevin Wright taking second place individually (John Barrett won the "booby" prize with the lowest score)! The team will compete at the State Finals Saturday March 25th at Landmark Lanes in Peoria. Further details will be provided on this event when all is finalized.

As our council has become a leader in the Rockford Diocese, this is our opportunity to lead by example through participating, sharing knowledge, and also receiving knowledge (i.e., sharing best practices).



Retention

We have over three hundred members listed our council membership rolls - many of whom we haven't seen or heard from in some years. It is the sincere wish of the council to have as many active Brothers involved with our good works as possible.

- If you have moved away, or for any other reason no longer wish to be a member of our council, please let us know, so we can begin the process of removing you from the Council membership rolls. We cannot, and will not, remove you from our membership rolls without your express direction to us.
