Tempus fugit. Memento Mori. Which is Latin for 'Time flies. Remember Death'

The Catholic Church identifies November as a month to pray for the faithful departed and contemplate the body of Christ and the life of the world to come. As such, our council just completed the Deceased Brother's Mass on November 3 to remember those Brothers who have departed this life. Thank You to Brother's Vic, Brendan, and Deacon Bob for coordinating this event. This mass is always very powerful reminder of the phrase 'Tempus Fugit. Memento Mori' with which all Knights are familiar and always reminds me to pause and contemplate the meaning of this phrase.

We Knights have a special model in Blessed Michael McGivney. His own life on earth was short (he died Aug. 14, 1890, at age 38), but he spent his time tirelessly practicing faith and charity. He saw the problems facing Catholics and the parish families in his day, and he acted, founding an Order that today is a blessing to millions around the globe.

With this as a backdrop, Brother Marcin Paprot, son of Brother Les Paprot recently passed away. Our prayers go out for Marcin and his family and friends.

Carmelite Father Wilfrid Stinissen (1927-2013) helps us put such experiences in perspective in his book *Eternity in the Midst of Time*. "If we look at man's purpose and destiny, which is to be introduced into the life of the Trinity, then it is clear that time is a gift. Time gives us a chance to grow," writes Father Stinissen, who later asks, "Is man only on a journey toward death ... or is he on a journey toward life?"

The month of October saw the Council complete the nine-day 'Novena for Life.' The Novena was very successful, as Brother Knights gathered along with other parishioners every day for nine days to pray the Novena.

A big shout out to Brother's Mike Kouvelis and Dan Limbach for coordinating a fantastic retreat at Long Lake in Wisconsin.

This is also an opportunity for existing 4th degree members to attend and observe the degree to refresh their memories on the lessons taught in this degree as well as support the new 4th degree members.

Reasons to advance to the 4th degree:

- Learn the patriotic lessons of the Knights of Columbus and how it ties into our faith
- The 4th degree is a part OF the Knights of Columbus not APART FROM the Knights of Columbus
- Gain the opportunity to participate in honor guards for various functions including wakes for our fallen brothers (arguably our most important duty as Knights of Columbus)
- Gain new friendships through Knights of Columbus at local parishes
- Learn about different programs, events, and service opportunities at some of the other local Knights of Columbus councils that you can take back to implement at your home council

The primary purpose of the Fourth Degree is to foster the spirit of patriotism by promoting responsible citizenship and generating a love of country encouraging active Catholic citizenship. The public appearance of Fourth Degree Knights as a Color Corps at religious and civic functions is an important activity, adding dignity and the pride of Church and country to any event. By these public demonstrations their loyalties bring credit to themselves and to the Knights of Columbus.

The Fourth Degree Honor Guard's ultimate goal is to "add dignity to the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy and to display pride for the religious freedom, a gift from God bestowed upon our Church and country." The Fourth Degree is a part **OF** the Knights of Columbus (not apart *FROM*), and is to COMPLIMENT (not compete with) council activities.

The Rockford Diocese Chapter was formed in 1989 by Bishop Arthur J. O'Neill and Past State Deputy/ Former Vice Supreme Master Joseph Kaltwasser. The purpose of the Chapter is to unite the Knights of Columbus councils within the Diocese and provide a forum for councils to share knowledge and experiences, discuss methods, procedures, ideas, or practices, as well as resolve or obtain assistance in resolving issues or questions and assist each council by providing the tools needed to help achieve Council goals.

The Chapter meets once every three months, on the fourth Wednesday of January, April, July, and October. This is open to all members of the Knights of Columbus in good standing, and is a great opportunity to meet and interact with your Knights of Columbus peers from other Parishes in the Diocese. The next meeting is Wednesday January 22nd at St. Joseph 722 High Street in Aurora, meeting will be virtual as well. Each year the Chapter hosts an annual roundtable dinner to honor a few men (both clergy and lay) for their contributions to the Knights of Columbus, the Catholic Church, and community. We have been blessed to have a few members of our council honored at this event in previous years. This event typically takes place the fourth Wednesday in September, thank you to everyone who attended the event last month.

In addition, each year the Chapter hosts an annual bowling tournament, where the winners advance to the state competition. For the past few years our council put together a team which took first place at the Diocese level and advanced to the State competition!

As Knights, we're responsible not only to our council, but to our larger organization. Each year our Council is required to pay to Supreme the dues owed by every registered member, even if members do not pay their dues themselves. Our Council has been doing this for years, whether our Brothers realize it or not. When we cover our Brother's unpaid dues, it comes from funds which would otherwise be used for our Charities.

Our first and foremost goal is Charity, followed by Unity and Fraternity. In these unprecedented times, we need to take care of ourselves, and we're asking our Brothers to do the following:

- Talk to your Brother Knights, check in on them, ask them how they are doing.
- Attend monthly meetings, or check in via Zoom, if you have health issues.
